Appointment of non-executive member of the Chapter and Lay Canon of Worcester Cathedral

The Chapter is delighted to announce that Staffan Engstrom has been appointed a non-executive member of the Chapter and Lay Canon of Worcester Cathedral. This is to fill one of the two new additional non-executive places on the Chapter. Staffan is well known to the Cathedral community. He and his wife Katie have regularly attended the 10.30 Sunday Eucharist since 2015. He assisted the Chapter in the formulation of the current Cathedral strategy, and he has served as a Director of Cathedral Enterprises Ltd since 2019. He is an active member of the Cathedral Eco Group.

Staffan Engstrom started work with Tarmac as a civil engineer in 1984, becoming a Chartered Engineer in 1992 and a Fellow of the Institution of Civil Engineers in 2012. He worked on numerous civil and building projects in engineering and management. As divisional Managing Director he had responsibility for heritage projects such as the Tate Britain and Royal Opera House, as well as for social housing, construction professional services, and plant and equipment. In corporate roles he worked on the demerger of Tarmac into two and the acquisition and integration of billions of pounds of sales through several deals. He also held responsibility for corporate services, including estates, IT, and corporate communications. In 2013, Staffan started his own strategy consulting business, mostly working for SMEs and some charities and NGOs.

Staffan will be installed as a Lay Canon of the Cathedral at Evensong at 5.30 p.m. on Monday 5 December.

Congregational Committee

As part of the implementation of the new Cathedrals Measure (the new statutory arrangements for the governance of cathedrals) the Chapter proposes to establish a new Congregational Committee, specifically to give a voice to the Cathedral's regular worshippers. As a first step we are setting up a 'shadow' Committee, to help the Chapter determine terms of reference, and we are inviting members of the Cathedral Community Roll to join it. There are places for nine members who will be appointed at the Annual Meeting on Sunday 27 November. If more than nine people come forward an election will take place. This new Congregational Committee will eventually replace the current Community Committee as a forum for discussion and conversation about matters of interest to regular worshippers, issues facing the deanery, diocese, and wider church, as well as providing an opportunity for exploring mission and social activities among the Cathedral Community.
