'God said, "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years'" (Genesis 1.14).

There are roughly $365^{1/4}$ days in a year, which is why every four years the Gregorian calendar inserts an extra day at the end of February. But because $365^{1/4}$ is only an approximation, years divisible by 100 are not leap years, unless they are also divisible by 400. Even so, leap seconds have to be inserted occasionally to keep everything properly aligned.

It's even more complicated than that. From an external frame of reference such as the stars, the Earth orbits the Sun every 365.2564 days. But because of the rotation of the Earth and the precession of the Earth's axis, the apparent solar year as viewed from the Earth is only 365.2422 days – about 20 minutes shorter than the 'true' or sidereal year.

St Oswald, whose feast day is on 29 February, was among many other things a patron of Abbo and Byrhtferth, two scholars whose work included calculations about the date of Easter and other calendrical complexities. Oswald himself was a capable administrator but who died while washing the feet of the poor, which perhaps tells us where our priorities should be.
