Worship in the Garden and Sacred Garden

We're delighted to introduce two new programmes of outdoor worship in 2024:

'Worship in the Garden – meeting with God in creation' will take place not inside the cathedral, but instead, we will be outside, come rain or shine. The vision is to develop a service that focuses on worship of the Creator in creation, with creation, and aware of ourselves as a part of creation. We will meet at 3pm on the first Sunday of each month, with the next meeting on 7 April.

'Sacred Garden: engaging with God in creation through creativity' is for people who feel God's presence when they're out in nature. Our goal is to create and cultivate a time and space in which people can engage with the Creator in creation through using their creativity. There will be opportunities for some art, some gardening, some kinaesthetic activity, and some contemplative prayer.

We will meet from 10am to 12pm on the third Saturday of each month, with the next meeting on 20 April.

The meeting place is in the garden behind 15b College Green (entering through the doorway outside the Edgar Tower Gate).
